BUSTURIALDEA REGIONAL PARTICIPATION FORUM

On December 11 and 12, the first sessions of the Regional Participation Forum, part of the Busturialdea-Urdaibai Regional Strategic Plan, were held.

From the **Guggenheim Urdaibai STOP Platform**, we would like to highlight the following:

- The platform was invited to this meeting exclusively thanks to the express request
 of one of the municipalities in Busturialdea, and not by the institutions promoting
 this Forum, namely the Provincial Council of Bizkaia and the Basque
 Government, with whom, until now, we have only held meetings at our own
 request.
- Our participation in this Forum has always had a single objective: to once again
 make our position clear regarding an issue that is central to us and that, one way or
 another, like it or not, is directly related not only to the future of this region but
 also to the Strategic Plan that may eventually be carried out. We refer to the
 Guggenheim Urdaibai project.
- The level of confusion is at its peak when the consultancy BMasi, which is in charge of carrying out the Forum, presents a document titled "Diagnosis of the Busturialdea-Urdaibai Region", in which there is no mention of this museum project. We do not understand how it is possible that, despite the institutions behind the Forum having labeled it a "strategic project" not only for the region but for the whole country, there is no reference to it in this foundational document.
- By omitting it, we believe the opportunity to discuss part of the Plan (the proposed Guggenheim Museum) within the framework of the Strategic Plan itself is being denied, which is a contradiction in terms; in other words, it is a "strategic project" that is not being debated within a "Strategic Plan".
- We believe that it is precisely the widespread public outcry against this project, and
 the undemocratic ways that various public administrations have used to try to
 impose it, that triggered the need to launch this institutional socioeconomic plan
 together with the Regional Participation Forum. Many political leaders have
 announced the imminent creation of forums for citizen participation and active
 listening regarding Guggenheim Urdaibai.

Therefore, the question we must ask is:

Our Platform has always expressed clear and firm opposition to this project and insists on the need to permanently halt it until a few simple but clarifying questions are answered:

- Is a Guggenheim Museum in Urdaibai really necessary?
- What is it for, and on what arguments is it based?

 (These arguments are more necessary than ever, especially considering the project is not mentioned in the presented diagnosis.)
- Why must we invest at least 140 million euros of public funds in favor of a foreign franchise?

(The Basque Lehendakari, Pradales, has recently stated clearly that public resources are limited.)

 Have its environmental, economic, social, identity, and cultural impacts been evaluated?

Where are those plans?

- Why is enormous public funding being used to "clear the way" for a project that is clearly opposed by a significant part of the public?
- As it currently stands, this Forum is merely a decorative justification for something that is already set to happen, controlled by a political elite far removed from any truly participatory, democratic, and citizen-oriented governance.

If this Participation Forum truly aims to be such, it should **decree the reversal**, **suspension**, **and/or annulment** of all those numerous and costly "land clearing" initiatives destined to pave the way for the Guggenheim Museum project—putting an end to **fait accompli and irreversible decisions** that make genuine deliberation on equal terms impossible.

- In addition to the serious democratic deficit we have already pointed out, we believe that this Forum blatantly violates the minimum standards of citizen participation set out in the Aarhus Convention, which the Spanish state has signed and is obliged to comply with. The same goes for the Basque Parliament Law of June 20, 2017, which called for a new review of the Master Plan for the Use and Management of the Urdaibai Biosphere Reserve.
- Our Platform wants to emphasize that it has always fully supported a genuine Economic, Social, and Cultural Reactivation Plan for our Region—one that is not shaped by the whims of disconnected leaders, but instead genuinely and effectively works to safeguard the environmental values of the Biosphere Reserve, which in recent decades have been left unprotected by these very institutions.
- Finally, everything leads us to believe that what is really behind this latest maneuver by the institutions—excluding the Guggenheim Urdaibai project from the Forum—is the lack of consensus it would face if presented as a flagship project in this Forum.

In fact, the initially announced cost of this museum project (140 million euros) is

greater than the total amount proposed for all future flagship projects combined (around 100 million euros), a figure clearly insufficient to meet the long-standing needs of Busturialdea.
