

MEETING WITH ELIXABETE ETXANOBE

Yesterday, **September 10**, the citizens' platform **Guggenheim Urdaibai Stop** held a meeting with the **General Deputy of the Provincial Council of Bizkaia**, **Elixabete Etxanobe Landajuela**.

We are grateful that this meeting was granted.

As a **broad and diverse citizens' platform**, we receive many concerns and fears from the public regarding the **Guggenheim Urdaibai project**. Likewise, we've heard various statements from representatives of certain administrations about this project.

We approached the meeting with a sense of responsibility and the intention to obtain as much detailed information as possible about the project.

Our goals were specific:

- On the one hand, we gave a **brief presentation of the platform**, clearly stating our objective: **to permanently abandon the Guggenheim Urdaibai project**.
- We also felt it was important to say that we want to be treated with respect. The
 platform will not tolerate being misrepresented, with statements attributed to it that
 were never made. Every step we take is clear and publicly documented.

We laid out all of our **concerns**, and shared some of the **questions** that arise from them.

These concerns can be summarized as follows:

- An impositional style of governance
- Actions that go against the purpose of Biosphere Reserves
- A project not based on any kind of diagnostic study
- The nonexistence of a clearly defined project
- Intervention in a Special Protection Area of the Natura 2000 Network (one of the most vulnerable zones)
- Clear evidence of saturation in the estuary
- Disregard for planetary boundaries

- Waste of public money for private interests
- A museum that does not respond to the needs of the region
- Manipulation of the public by linking the healthy future of the Biosphere Reserve to the project
- The launch of whitewashed participatory processes
- Promotion of the loss of local culture

Given the direction this project is taking, it is **vital to resolve the questions** we have raised. That was **not possible today**; we were told that the **technical nature** of our questions requires further consultation, and that **there will be time** to address them later.

We asked them to **propose a timeline**. Let it be so.

The General Deputy assured us that the project being developed **will be beneficial for the region**, even while insisting that the project is **not yet fully defined or decided**, and that there are still **various administrative steps** to be taken to make it viable.

In fact, the **lack of a concrete project** was the main reason they gave for not understanding why the Platform opposes it.

Our response was clear:

Even if we don't have a fully developed project, we **know its components** and the **steps** already taken in each of them, and it is evident that we disagree with the objectives being pursued and the way they are being implemented.

There is a **lack of genuine public participation**, a **lack of a shared diagnosis** of the region's needs, and **no consideration of alternatives**—all of which are essential for a truly participatory and inclusive governance model, **without imposition**.

Everyone should participate **on equal footing**, with the opportunity to **express their views and engage in debate from the outset**, always with the goal of improving both the situation of the citizens and the territory.

Decisions have already been made—to such an extent that **public participation has become meaningless**.

To conclude, we also expressed our **well-founded doubts** about who will **really benefit** from this museum project, given that the possibility of **not building it has never even been considered**.

The **private interests of the Guggenheim Bilbao Foundation** cannot be allowed to determine the **future of an entire region**.

This meeting has not changed our view of the project—not in the slightest.

Today we are **more convinced than ever** that this project is nothing more than a **misguided initiative**, proposed without any diagnostic assessment, that **requires changes to laws and protective regulations** just to be made viable.
